Thanksgiving, Christmas, New Years

My heart is burdened for our Christian teens as they are daily in the world and I am moved to pray especially for them as we bring our students names before the King, our all-powerful and all-knowing Father in heaven. Some believing teens cling to a set of rules, a check list of sorts: go to church, read your Bible, witness, wear certain clothes, warn those around you not to sin, sport Christian symbols in your jewelry and on the bumper of your car, shun the ungodly, etc.. In the right spirit-the moving of the Holy Spirit-these are fine. Quite often, though, these rules can lead to legalism and judgmental attitudes, leaving no room for warmth or compassion and leaving the door wide open for guilt and defeat when the rules are inevitably broken. On the other hand some teens have thrown off this yoke of legalism to “blend in with the world to better witness to those around them,” only to get caught in worldly ways and abandon their faith. Paul speaks of this struggle in Galatians 5 when he states, “It was for freedom that Christ set you free, therefore keep standing firm and do not be subject again to a yoke of slavery... For in Christ Jesus neither circumcision nor uncircumcision (externals) means anything, but faith working through love.” And later, “For we were called to freedom, brethren; only do not turn your freedom into an opportunity for the flesh, but through love serve one another.” Paul concludes chapter 5 with a contrast in the works of the flesh: “adultery, fornication, uncleanness, lewdness, idolatry, sorcery hatred, contentions, jealousies, outbursts of wrath, selfish ambitions, dissensions, heresies, envy, murders, drunkenness, revelries and the like” and the fruits of the Spirit: “love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control.”

Let us pray as Jesus did in John 17, “I do not pray that you take them out of the world, but that you keep them from the evil one...Sanctify them by Your truth. Your word is truth.” The Greek thought in this word *sanctify*, *hagiazō*, is “to withdraw from fellowship with the world by first gaining fellowship with God.” In John 4 the Samaritan woman, parched by the ways of the world, was offered living water by One who knew her intimately. This “Living Water,” fellowship with Jesus Himself, would not only satisfy her every longing, but would become a “fountain, springing up to eternal life” to those around her.

We must pray diligently that the Holy Spirit of the Living God would woo our students to His well of life and that they would go there frequently to fellowship with Him. That they would be convicted of sin and be refreshed through His cleansing and that the spiritual thirsts of those around them would be whetted from the fountain of their changed lives.
